- Threads of Resistance is a free exhibition led by emerging artists using visual arts, video documentary, and photography to express and prompt critical dialogue around art and activism.
- *Threads of Resistance* launches on Nov. 3 at 5pm, at Withrow Common Gallery (200 Princes' Blvd. at the CNE) and continues until Nov. 15. Press is invited to attend and promote.
- The exhibition celebrates the 25th Anniversary of SKETCH Working Arts. Since 1996, SKETCH has engaged over 18,000 young people on the margins making radical art to transform lives and communities.

October 18, 2022 (Toronto, ON) Toronto's arts-and-culture-going public are invited to **Threads of Resistance**, running from November 3-15 at Withrow Common Gallery (200 Princes' Blvd, at the CNE). Guests can expect thought-provoking, eclectic pieces that reveal how radical art can cultivate social change and confront power structures and inequalities within our society.



Since May 2022, eight artist-researchers have been collaborating with former SKETCH Directors, Phyllis Novak and Rose Gutierrez, to visually map SKETCH's 25-year journey and tease out key moments of artistic activism within broader social, political, and cultural contexts.

The result is Threads of Resistance, a collaborative, immersive exhibition that will inspire guests and celebrate the incredible artists and arts workers who have been a part of building SKETCH since 1996.
